#### Call for papers

The International Conference *Language and Territory* (Sudbury, Canada, 2010; Tbilissi, Georgia, 2015; Kenitra, Morocco, 2017) brought together numerous speakers and researchers world-wide. The events were a great forum to discuss the judicial status of national, regional and minority languages, their evolution, their loss, as well as their day-to-day use by speakers in a variety of cultural and artistic fields (literature, education, heritage, audiovisual media, film, music, politics, public display and signage, etc.).

Regional and minority languages, and the territories in which they evolve and interact, always raise delicate and difficult issues, because languages are always at the core of the political projects of a given territory, region or state. Through languages, be they be official or co-official, in contact or not with other languages, researchers seek a better understanding of the linguistic communities that make use of them and of the territorial dynamics they present. The study, the protection and the promotion of regional and minority languages help maintain the cultural resources and the patrimony of a territory, of a region, of a country.

The Università di Trento (Italy), located in the region of Trentino-Alto Adige, will host the fourth edition of the International conference on *Language and Territory* from June 24<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup>, 2019. Trentino-Alto Adige is an especially appropriate location for such a scholarly gathering, given the region's unique sociolinguistic dynamic resulting from German-speaking majority in the Alto Adige and the various language minorities located in Trentino: Ladin, Mocheno and Cimbrian.

*Language and Territory 4* welcomes individual papers and session proposals that address the general theme of the conference. Participants may address different issues pertaining to the interaction between language and territory, among which, the following:

- Language planning
- Language contact
- Literary geography
- Language and virtual territory
- Language, territory and law
- Language, territory and education
- Language, territory and history
- Language, territory and identity
- Language industry and territory

- Language, territory and oral patrimony (tales, songs, etc.)
- Language, territory and philosophy
- Language, territory and politics
- Language, territory and religion
- Language, territory and journeys
- Language, territory and translation
- Sociolinguistic and urban ecology

You are invited to submit a proposal for an individual paper or a full session. All proposals will be subject to approval by a scientific committee. Individual presentations are limited to 20 minutes followed by a 10 minute question period. Though papers may address any languages, presentations are to be delivered in English, in French, in German or in Italian.

The deadline for individual presentation proposals is **October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018**.

The deadline for submitting a full session is **October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018**.
